A gift from Bookbug!

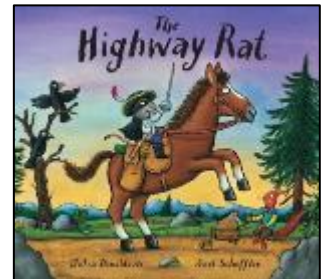
All anti-preschool children will receive the Bookbug Explorer pack this week which includes stories, songs and rhymes to share with your child.

Show & Tell

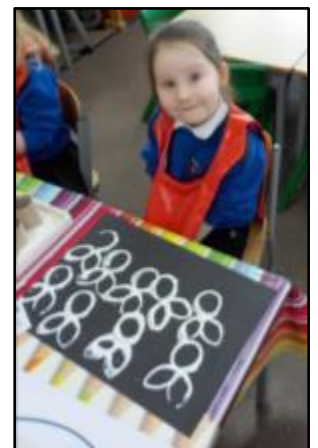

What have we been learning?

This term we will be focusing on further developing our fine motor skills. Fine motor skills are the building blocks required to carry out activities that require controlled and precise movements. Activities that use fine motor skills are self-care tasks such as doing up buttons and using a knife & fork and school tasks such as writing and cutting with scissors.

Activities that improve fine motor skills are ones that allow a child to develop specific aspects of the underlying skills.



This week some children have been busy working on their **pincer** and **tripod** grip moving water beads from one place to another and building with small Lego.



We have also been learning to recognise signs of spring. We spotted lots of signs whilst out on a walk to the woods. Encourage your child to look for other signs of spring when you are out and about and they can share this information and knowledge with their peers during gather.
